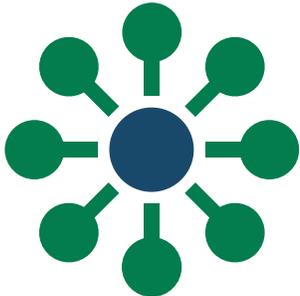

Why a Lottery?

State-Mandated Process (This Was Not Optional)

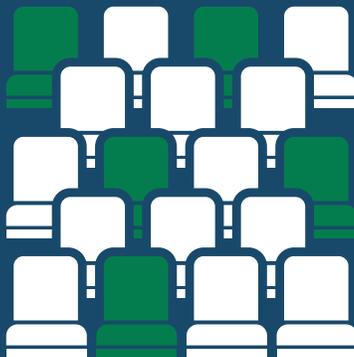
- ➔ As of Spring 2025, Massachusetts requires regional vocational schools to use a lottery-based admissions system with a waitlist to ensure fair and equitable access for students across all member communities.



The Goal

Equity Across All 17 Member Communities

- ➔ Fair Access—Not First-Come, First-Served
- ➔ Every member community is guaranteed an equitable opportunity for Grade 9 enrollment



How Seats Are Allocated

Data-Driven, Not Arbitrary

- ➔ Each community's Grade 8 population is calculated as a percentage of the total Grade 8 population across all 17 member communities. That percentage is then applied to the target enrollment of 425 students to determine each community's minimum enrollment target.
- ➔ Communities with a small population are guaranteed a minimum of five seats.
- ➔ This approach reflects the relative size of each sending community.

All applicants for Fall 2026 admission will be included in the lottery-based admissions process.

ENSATS 17 Member Community Lottery Process

Transparent.

Structured.

Consistent.

- 1** Submit a Complete Application
- 2** Receive a randomized at-large lottery number
- 3** Seats are filled in multiple rounds to ensure that all communities reach their minimum targets
- 4** Any unused seats are redistributed using the at-large lottery order

Why this works:

-  Eliminates ambiguity
-  Reinforces “same number, every step”
-  Quietly counters favoritism claims
